## HS 9 $^{\text {th }}$ Grade Guidance

Freshman year is an important year for you emotionally and academically. You transitioned to high school where we have higher expectations for you. You are learning how to be more independent from your parents and are learning more about yourself. More independence means more responsibility. In high school, you need to begin advocating for yourself. This means taking the initiative to communicate with your teachers, your coaches, your counselor and your assistant principal when you need something. We cannot help you if you do not talk to us.

Things to keep in mind:
Grades - They all count!!! Your grades a permanent part of your academic history/transcript. Each six weeks grade counts for $26.7 \%$ of your semester grade and the final exam is $20 \%$. These four grades are used to calculate your semester grade.
$\left(1^{\text {st }} 6\right.$ wks grade $\left.\times 26.7\right)+\left(2^{\text {nd }} 6\right.$ wks $\left.X 26.7 \%\right)+\left(3^{\text {rd }} 6 \mathrm{wks}+26.7 \%\right)+($ final exam $\times 20 \%)=$ semester 1 grade
$\left(4^{\text {th }} 6\right.$ wks grade $\left.\times 26.7\right)+\left(5^{\text {th }} 6\right.$ wks $\left.\times 26.7 \%\right)+\left(6^{\text {th }} 6 \mathrm{wks}+26.7 \%\right)+($ final exam $\times 20 \%)=$ semester 2 grade

Credits - Grade levels in high school are based on credits. If you do not pass your classes, you do not earn credits. If you do not earn the number of credits needed, you will not move on to the next grade level.
$0-5.5$ Credits $=9^{\text {th }}$ Grade
$6-11.5$ credits $=\mathbf{1 0}^{\text {th }}$ grade
$12-18.5$ credits $=\mathbf{1 1}^{\text {th }}$ grade
$19+$ credits $=12^{\text {th }}$ grade
